Editorial from the Church of the Good Shepherd

August 2025

Was it just my imagination or did summers seem endless when I was a child? They were long days filled with sunshine and laughter, friends and outdoor games. I remember building dens, swinging on rope swings, riding bikes and lying on the grass watching the clouds float by.

As an adult summers feel less appealing. We look forward to those longer days but, just as we realise they are upon us, they slip away in the blink of an eye. We are left wondering why we didn't spend more time enjoying the warm evenings and sunny days. Time marches on relentlessly; we can't save it, put it on hold or revisit it.

As we read the gospels and the stories Jesus told, it's easy to think that He was with His disciples, teaching about the kingdom of God, forever. In reality, from the first calling of His disciples to His death on the cross and resurrection was just three years - three short years. Yet, during this time, He managed to connect with people through conversation such as the woman at the well in the heat of the day. He shared stories about living life not through religion but through love for one another. He spent time with the sick, with lepers, who no one else wanted to be around, and with beggars that everyone else simply walked past, unnoticed. He transformed a group of twelve strangers into friends who experienced God in a profoundly different way.

Even though Jesus had just three busy years, He never seemed hurried or rushed. He taught us to be childlike, to see life through the eyes of children. So perhaps, as we rush around this summer, we can take a moment to pause and lie on the grass, watching the clouds drift by instead of focusing on the endless tasks still to be done.

Notes from Borough Green Parish Council

The Council met at 7.00pm Tuesday 7th July 2025 at the COGS Annexe. Matters raised included:



- Retirement Barry Glew. After 15 years of exemplary service, our well known and much loved groundsman Barry is retiring, and he and his wife Jackie were invited to a short ceremony at the start of the Parish Council meeting. After receiving our thanks, Barry was presented with a plaque of the Borough Green Coat of Arms, but in West Ham colours, and a photo collage of memorable times during his years of service. His colleagues Rob and Ken were also in attendance.
- Conyerd Road residents voiced their concerns about the overgrowth at the
 junction with Quarry Hill. As well as obscuring sightlines, tree branches are
 catching passing traffic. The land ownership is unknown so the Parish Council
 has agreed that it will first establish ownership. We have already
 submitted a KCC Highway's complaint and have searches lodged with Land
 Registry.
- Mountain Bikers. It had been noticed that an informal group of mountain bikers are using a virtually inaccessible part of Isles Quarry. At the same time we have been approached by another group seeking just such a facility. We have put both groups together and asked them to return at the next meeting with a formal proposal. We are very aware for the need of such a facility and, with a cost free licence, we are happy to support this enterprise.
- New Councillor. We were pleased to co-opt Mrs Nikki Proto to the Council.
- Recreation Ground Pavilion. After some considerable discussion, the
 contract for the new roof and internal refurbishment has been awarded to
 local company Honeycomb Construction. Earlier in the year Honeycomb had
 carried out major damp proofing work behind the Pavilion and, despite
 appalling weather and conditions, carried out a very messy job with
 minimum impact on Rec users. We have various grant applications lodged
 to defray the costs.
- Civil Enforcement Officers have been very visible in the village in past weeks since we committed funds and joined this TMBC scheme. Whilst CEOs do not have the same powers as Police Officers, they can issue penalty notices, are a reassuring uniformed presence around the village and have been well briefed on the areas where trouble is likely to occur.
- A new litterbin has been installed on our Harrison Rd land at Quarry Hill and that will hopefully encourage the public to keep the area litter free.
- 30mph stickers for our wheelie bins proved very successful and the Parish Council has a new supply contact the Clerk or your nearest Parish Councillor, particularly if you live on a main road.
- **BGPC Van.** It does not seem possible that over 5 years have passed since we leased the BGPC electric van for the ground staff. The Clerk has used his well honed negotiating skills and a new e-Vivaro van will be delivered shortly, with a significantly higher spec than the old one and nearly £40 per month cheaper. Community Campaigns Update 2025

SPEED WATCH

Many of our folk have rightly raised their concerns over 'speeding vehicles' coming in and out of the village. Fortunately, most vehicles on the A25 and A227 abide by the road signs but we are all aware that some are continuously breaking the speed limits and, in some cases, doing ridiculous high speeds inches from the pavements where our children walk to school and our elderly walk to the shops.

Currently, we cannot provide passing through traffic with an alternative to bypassing our villages of West Kent but our campaign to see the slip roads re-instated in the vicinity of J5 M25 Sevenoaks continues with central government. These slip roads would connect the M26 and A21 enabling passing through freight and vehicles to reach Sevenoaks, Tonbridge and Maidstone areas without having to come through our villages - a big improvement in quality of life, environment, health from air pollution and safety. But this traffic reduction campaign is with UK Government whilst we now focus on reducing the speed of the traffic through the village. Much of this traffic shouldn't be here and wouldn't be here if we had the thorough parliamentary representation and chase to see the slip roads home and dry.

So, our speed reduction campaign focuses on setting up a Community Speed Watch Group in liaison with Kent Police and their Kent Community Speed Watch team. Speed watch is a community-based scheme that helps volunteers make their local roads safer by reducing speeding without penalising passing drivers.

Borough Green Parish Council have expressed their support to see a Borough Green Community Speed Watch Group established and offering to provide 3 of their parish councillors on the Community Group as well as provide any supportive funding that might be required by Kent Police. But it will not be a sub-group of BGPC

Would you like to help improve the safety of our residents from speeding vehicles by joining the community speed watch team? A truly great initiative that is guided by Kent Police Speed Watch team who can provide all that is needed. The team would set up its own way of working guided by Kent Police and meet as necessary both in planning the speed watch events along the roads of the village and actually undertaking the speed watch checks.



Please let me know if you have any questions or interest in helping to set up the Speed Watch Group. A few residents have already shown that interest but due to personal family bereavements I have not had the capacity until now to properly take this forward for those and all our residents. Look forward to hearing from you.

Following on from our AGM the committee has been busy formulating our ideas for the coming year. We are delighted to outline for you some of our plans which really focus on upgrades that will benefit all our users.

New Front Doors.

KCC update

Leader of KCC Linden Kemkaran told Council Members on 10 July that her newly-installed Department for Local Government Efficiency has already identified millions of pounds worth of potential savings which can be redirected back into vital services. The Leader said that, seven weeks after the election, she had a number of "exciting propositions" that she and her team will take forward through the formal council governance process in the months to come that will see Kent taxpayers' money spent in a more effective way.

For more details of the propositions go to the press release on the KCC website https://news.kent.gov.uk/ but they include scrapping the Net Zero Renewal Energy Programme of property modifications, discarding the Net Zero plan to transition the KCC vehicle fleet to all electric, bringing children's care homes back in-house, streamlining the home to school service and reviewing plans to sell Sessions House in Maidstone (and refurbish Invicta House).

The Leader has also written to a number of Government Departments about the impact of policies on Kent and again details are on the above website.

Members have agreed to a 5% cut in allowances which will generate around £200 thousand to boost Members' grants which can be donated to grassroots community projects.

Tom Tugendhat MP's Column

We all know how potholes have become a persistent plaque on our roads. Indeed, 95% of claims to local authorities from drivers are related to potholes. A third of Kent County Council's (KCC) highways and road maintenance expenditure is spent on pothole repairs. But we all know more needs to be done.

On average, 14,922 potholes were filled per authority in England over the past year. However, there were 24,217 potholes and road surface problems reported to KCC, which – although down from the year before – is unacceptable. According to the Department for Transport, 53% of Kent's roads have been flagged for maintenance. The Government - both Labour and Conservative - have given KCC more than £202 million over the last 5 years for highways and roads maintenance.

We now have a County Council who have pledged to fill in every single pothole. So, I want to help them do that. I have created a dedicated page on my website - www.tomtugendhat.org/potholes - where you can share with me any pothole you see, whether it be in your road, on your journey to work or simply as you're walking past.

Please share with me as much information as you can, including the location of the pothole and, if you can get one safely, a picture. I will then contact KCC directly, on your behalf, to ensure they are doing as promised - and repairing every single pothole across every single street in Borough Green.

Medway Aircraft Preservation Society Limited (MAPSL). The aircraft was built in the Short Brothers factory that was once located on Rochester Esplanade, a short walk from the Cathedral.

Constructed in 1937, the plane saw service in the Second World War before becoming a civilian aircraft. After years of disuse it had deteriorated significantly. Thanks to a grant from Rochester Bridge Trust, volunteers from MAPSL have painstakinaly restored it.

Alongside the Floatplane will be a series of fun and educational activities for the whole family. An accompanying exhibition, Pioneers of Flight: Made in Medway will run alongside the activities. Curated by Allison Young, it will explore Medway's pivotal role in aviation history and the lasting impact of the Short Brothers. Featuring a rich collection of artefacts and archival materials, the exhibition includes contributions from many local partners. Open to the public from 1 August to 31 August. Admission during the day will be free although charges may apply for additional activities and evening events.

Submission to Kent Friends of Trees Potters Mede Sports Centre - Woodland Walk



Potters Mede was established in the 1980s as a sports field. We inherited a one hectare patch of Ancient Woodland on the northwest of the field and have developed a magical Woodland Walk that seems to go on and on, but then you pop out a couple of hundred yards from where you started. The Woodland Walk is home to about 30 huge straight oaks all between 60 and 80ft high, probably planted in the days when straight oak was still needed for ship and house construction.

In 2015 the 1911 Coronation Oak commemorating King George V in Rock Road died, but local residents had already begun growing new trees in pots from acorns saved in the previous years. That same year a commendation from the Kent Men of The Trees won us a bundle of indigenous tree whips. There was a triangle of grass adjacent to the existing Woodland Walk that was planted up by volunteers that is now starting to develop into great little wood. There are also multiple self seeded oaks and hawthorns from our new trees.



In years to come our new patch will integrate into the existing woodland - we won't see that, but I wonder what Borough Green will be like then?
