Editorial from the Church of the Good Shepherd August 2024

The 4 Degrees....

Perhaps because of the number of weddings we have at the church this summer, I've been thinking about love.

Back in the 12th century, Bernard of Clairvaux wrote about the four degrees of love. The first is "Loving Yourself For Your Own Sake (Selfish Love)". This is not about self-indulgence but knowing that you are loveable and deserving of love. From that, love of others can grow.

The second degree is "Loving God for Your Own Blessing (Dependence on God)". We love God because of what God does for us. I think this is where many people get stuck. How many friendships end because people didn't give us what we wanted? If things don't seem to be going well, we give up on God, because clearly we are not loved. Bernard would say that when things are going badly is the time we should turn to God even more.

The third degree is "Loving God for God's Own Sake (Intimacy with God)". By turning to God, even in times of trouble, we discover the delight of knowing Him. We learn to enjoy God for God's sake and also to love what God loves. This is the end point for most people most of the time, with a few only occasionally reaching the fourth degree.

"Self-Love for God's Sake (Being United with God's Love)". The idea here is that we lose ourselves so completely in our love of God that we find our true selves, unfiltered by the world. As Jesus said, those who lose their life will find it. For Bernard, "In heaven the fourth degree of love is attained forever".

Though Bernard was writing about our love of God, these degrees could also be applied to our love for other people who love us.

Where we might go wrong is trying to jump ahead without spending time in lower orders. After all, many of us have been taught to avoid any idea of being selfish, so let's skip one and two. On the other hand, people who have suffered abuse often find it hard to ever learn to properly love themselves because they were taught that they are unloveable.

Perhaps during this summer, we could reflect on our relationships. Our love for others and maybe our love for God. Which degree are we on? Perhaps we might ask to grow deeper in love for the other and work towards gaining a higher degree.

The children attend Children's Church every 2 weeks and on the odd 5th Sunday, with an expanding group of children meeting with 6 regulars and 3-4 others joining every so often. The children are continuing to enjoy the stories, crafts and games that reflect the theme of the week. We have written our own commandments, made cards for the congregation and learnt about trust and following God's word with Jonah and the Whale.

The children worked very hard in the summer of 2023 for their presentation service which they presented on 9 July. The theme was prayer where the children demonstrated all the different ways you can pray, such as using candles, prayer cushions and even paper aeroplanes.

In the Autumn term we explored our faith through crafts and stories. We made jam tarts with homemade jam to celebrate harvest and prepared for the nativity play by colouring in figures from the Christmas story and making a beautiful star to carry.

The children put on a brilliant nativity play, which was narrated by our oldest member, and supported by the congregation singing hymns and bringing up the figures for the nativity scene. The children all played very angelic angels, welcoming and proclaiming the arrival of Jesus.

The Spring term has seen a variety of fun games and crafts. We made our own Wilderness from sand, rocks and twigs found outside and did an Easter Story Medley - making palms for Palm Sunday, wooden lolly stick crosses for Good Friday and delicious Easter Egg biscuits for Easter Sunday. We shared our love for our mothers on Mothering Sunday making garlands of thanks, made birds to mark the Big Garden Birdwatch, learnt how to listen for God by listening to the sound of the wind, the ocean, storms, birdsong and bees buzzing and most recently learnt about Jesus as the vine and made our own fruit salad from the good deeds we can do to be more like Jesus.

Notes from Borough Green Parish Council



The Council met at 7.30pm Monday 1st July 2024. Matters discussed and reports received included:

- **BG Scouts Group** moved to their new home at Potters Mede on 15 June, a move made urgent by their eviction from their home for the past 40 years by Reynolds Retreat. The Scouts will be welcome at Potters Mede either as a permanent home or as a shorter term venue whilst they find new land and funding. Initially it will just be the Scouts, Cubs and Beavers, but there is also space for the Guides and Explorers if they need it. The PC have provided two 20' shipping containers to store their equipment.
- **TMBC Local Plan** seeks to build 16,000 houses across the Borough to satisfy increasingly impossible housing targets set by Government (whatever colour ties they wear). It seems that the threat of Borough Green Garden City 3000 houses has receded, but TMBC still plans significant development amongst our rural villages. It became apparent when the new Government took office that they had urgent plans to reform and reset the planning system to enable housing. It made no sense to continue spending public money developing a Local Plan which may be scrapped, so it was decided at an Emergency Cabinet meeting to suspend the Plan until we have a clear idea what our targets will be. This could allow a valuable breathing space to allow evidence still being assembled to be completed and to look carefully at the distribution of housing across the Borough a more measured approach to ensure fairness.
- A new High Speed Fibre internet connection is being installed at Potters Mede. As well as giving hirers full access, it will also allow the power company real time monitoring of the solar power being fed back into the National Grid.
- The Ladies section of the Public Toilets in the Village Hall car park will be shut for a few days to allow a new door to be installed, opening onto the car park instead of the current dark and unsafe side access.
- **Basted Mill** residents have become increasingly concerned about families of ducks "sun-bathing" on Basted Lane, a very real hazard to them now that we have so much rat-running through traffic. Locals have already installed two "Caution-Ducks" signs (thank you) and Borough Green and Platt Parish Councils are installing two more advance warning signs.
- We have significant concerns about new rules being introduced by the Village Hall Management Committee and we have asked the Charity Commission to intervene. The village hall is owned by the people of Borough Green and is supposed to be run by three Trustees who are elected by public vote at the Annual General Meeting. They intend installing a permanent committee chosen by them with no public involvement at all. As we have discovered in the past from an incident arising with a previous committee, you also have the right to call an Extraordinary General Meeting and hold the committee to account.
- **Surgery Parking** has eased dramatically since the section of Basted House Drive has had a porous parking area installed, allowing medical staff to park outside releasing more parking spaces in the surgery for patients, and we have had grateful comments already. One of the reasons the PC purchased the Harrison Rd land was to allow any future surgery expansion. By default we also ended up with that section of drive, so we can help the surgery without losing any of that little gem of wild land.

Council to assess impact of planning changes announced by new government



(Press release issued on 15 July)

Government plans to make significant changes to national planning policy have prompted Tonbridge and Malling to wait for more details before proceeding to the next stage of developing its Local Plan.

The Chancellor Rachel Reeves set out the government's intentions in a speech on 8 July. She said her intention was "to agree the urgent action needed to fix our planning system" and to set out changes to the National Planning Policy Framework by the end of July 2024 which will have a direct impact on the shape of Local Plans going forward.

The Tonbridge and Malling Local Plan is mid-way through its development. The plan will serve as a blueprint for how the borough develops between now and the 2040s. It will identify locations where new homes can be built, along with a range of policies on environmental protections and safeguards for areas and assets of historic importance.

Given the significance of the changes being proposed, Tonbridge and Malling Borough Council says it will assess the implications of these changes once published before moving forward with the next stage in its Local Plan process.

Leader of the council, Matt Boughton, said: "The government has very clearly indicated its intention to make a raft of significant changes to planning across the country. As this will involve new national rules that all councils will be expected to follow, it seems inevitable that there will be a significant impact across a range of policy areas which could meaningfully alter the requirements for developing Local Plans. Given we are in the process of developing our own Local Plan for Tonbridge and Malling, we need to know more about what the government is proposing before moving forward to the next stage. While this is not ideal, it will be better to have certainty so we can move forward with a robust plan which both complies with national policy and delivers for the people of our borough."

Health and Wellbeing Coaches (HWBC) support people aged 18 and over to increase their ability to self-manage, motivation levels and commitment to change their lifestyle. They are experts in behaviour change and focus on improving health related outcomes by working with people to set personalised goals and change their behaviours. They work with people with physical and/or mental health conditions and those at risk of developing them in a one-one-one or group setting.

The Health and Wellbeing Coach service can support people to improve their physical activity levels, diet and eating habits, sleep hygiene,



long term condition management and general wellbeing. We are unable to support patients' whose main concern is alcohol consumption, smoking cessation or higher level mental health. Patients have access to up to 6 sessions of coaching support during this time.

HWBCs can be an effective intervention for people experiencing a range of conditions. Working with an HWBC allows you to have a voice in the development of your support, it places you in the driving seat to take control of your health/issue. Using techniques such as motivational interviewing, the HWBC will facilitate an environment where the patient is able to build resilience and accountability, and feel comfortable to think and speak freely. Information is given rather than advice where appropriate, with the aim of placing the task of problem solving on the patient, rather than the HWBC.

Have your say on the KCC budget (Extracts from press release

Extracts trom press release issued on 13 June)

Services residents want to see prioritised, ideas for cost savings and income generation, and future increases in Council Tax are the basis of questions in an eight-week budget consultation launched by Kent County Council (KCC).

The setting of the annual KCC budget is once again a challenging process for 2025-26. The estimated budget gap is $\pounds 81$ million and with some of the authority's reserves having been used to bolster recent years' budgets, further tough choices will need to be considered.

Significant spending demands and cost increases, largely for the most vulnerable residents in the areas of adult and children's social care and home to school transport, continue to squeeze the budget. Complex needs, population growth and people living longer are all factors that are contributing to the financial pressures of authorities across the UK as well recent high levels of inflation and significant increases in National Living Wage in recent years adding pressure on budgets. The Government requires local authorities to deliver a balanced budget, which means planned spending must be managed within funding resources available.

KCC is also closely reviewing all of its operations year-on-year to identify opportunities to save money wherever it can. That has included accelerating the use of digital technology and looking at its premises estate to ensure the right buildings are in the right places to achieve its net zero ambitions.

In this year's budget consultation, residents will be asked their views on an increase in their Council Tax, along with suggestions as to how and where KCC can make cuts in services which are necessary to ensure the financial sustainability of the Council.

The budget consultation closes on 7 August. Further information:
