Love actually...

"Whenever I get gloomy with the state of the world, I think about the arrivals gate at Heathrow Airport. General opinion's starting to make out that we live in a world of hatred and greed, but I don't see that. It seems to me that love is everywhere. Often, it's not particularly dignified or newsworthy, but it's always there — fathers and sons, mothers and daughters, husbands and wives, boyfriends, girlfriends, old friends. When the planes hit the Twin Towers, as far as I know, none of the phone calls from the people on board were messages of hate or revenge — they were all messages of love. If you look for it, I've got a sneaky feeling love, actually ... is all around."

You might recognise the opening words to the film Love Actually. I just happened to catch them the other day and realised, having never watched the film all the way through, that I hadn't heard them before. But with the news over the last few weeks, with terrible stabbings in Southport and the subsequent riots, these words seemed particularly striking. The violence and hate were much reported but. alongside that, there was love actually. Love for the families whose daughters were killed, love for the communities that were smashed up in riots, with people clearing up, helping out, and rebuilding. Love for those who were the target of racial hatred. There was even love for the police who stood in the face of violence, with people providing them refreshments when they could.

There does seem to be a lot of hatred in the world, anger and violence. But, there is also a lot of love. And the message we find in the Bible is that the more hatred we encounter, the more we need to love. For it is love that will overcome hatred. "Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who abuse you." And if we choose to look for it love can be found everywhere for, after all, God is love and there is nowhere where God isn't. So as the film says, love, actually ... is all around.

So perhaps, if you encounter hate, you might try love as your response. Or if you find yourself being filled with hate or anger, you might seek the God of love and ask Him to fill your heart instead.



Notes from Borough Green Parish Council

The Council met at 7.30pm Monday 5th August 2024. Matters discussed and reports received included:



The Parish Council are issuing the following statement:

'The Parish Council have tried to work in a supportive and collaborative manner with the Borough Green Village Hall Management Committee over the recent transition of their committee and the running of the Village Hall. We have offered them advice, funding and resource in an attempt to promote constructive relationships. We wish to emphasise the point that all decisions relating to the management of the Village Hall are the responsibility of their committee, which is completely distinct and separate from the Parish Council.' - AGREED UNANIMOUSLY

- The Parish Council will be vacating the Parish Office in the Village Hall from 31st October, and future Council meetings will be held at Potters Mede, but we are looking longer term at a venue nearer the centre of the village. The Parish Office never fulfilled its role as a point of access to the PC, but was maintained even through Covid.
- **BG Scouts Group** are settling in nicely at their new home at Potters Mede and we are proud to have been able to help in their hour of need. This is a hugely valuable community youth facility and could not be allowed to fail.
- TMBC Local Plan It has been reported to the PC that it has been completely shelved until they have a clear idea what the new Government's changes to the planning system will be and what new housing targets will be imposed. One new policy proposed in the new National Planning Policy Framework is that all Mineral Extraction sites will be reclassified as "Previously Developed Land" and renamed "Grey Belt". Borough Green and surrounding villages have suffered 150 years of quarrying, blasting, landfill, thousands of HGVs thundering through our rural lanes under the belief that one day when works ended all this land would be restored to its former agricultural use, and we would once more become quiet rural villages. Minerals are a nationally important resource, we have "done our bit" and now we have been betrayed by our country and its Government a longstanding promise has been broken.
- TMBC Leader Cllr Matt Boughton issued this statement:

"If the Government really wanted to build more homes, it wouldn't be looking to reduce the housing targets for big cities including London and Labour-controlled authorities like Medway and Thanet, while significantly increasing the figures it asks Tonbridge and Malling to provide.

With over 70% of Tonbridge and Malling classed as greenbelt land, over a third a National Landscape, and requirements to 'build beautiful' deleted from the Planning Framework, our green spaces are now under greater threat than they have ever been before from a predatory Government.

Tonbridge and Malling has been forced to delay its Local Plan and now the Deputy Prime Minister, Angela Rayner, has effectively told us to redo much of our hard work. This is a deep disappointment for our towns and villages and we will be responding in the strongest possible terms."

• **Public Toilets** in the Village Hall car park will be shut for a few more days to complete the new access, and to upgrade the lighting so it is less gloomy and dingy.

Borough Green & Wrotham Railway Station Car Park

Southeastern are making changes to car park payments at a number of stations including Borough Green. This is ahead of works taking place for automatic number plate recognition installations later this year. In preparation for this customers will no longer be able to purchase daily or weekly parking tickets at the ticket office or ticket vending machine from 19 August. Customers will be expected to pay for parking using options on signs at the car park (APCOA connect app, phone, online, QR code).

Village Hall Management Committee - AGM

The Borough Green Village Hall Management Committee held their Annual General Meeting for 2023/4 on 22 July. Normally the AGM is held around April but with general upheaval



locally, updating of deeds and policies, and changes in the committee it was felt wise to delay until there was some clear stability and progress to report on. Over the recent months there has been a renewed focus and energy given to the committee that has brought about some major improvements around the hall and an impetus to bring about further developments to the benefit of users and the community.

During the AGM the Chair summarised by highlighting some of the recent achievements including amongst others: online booking, updated accounting and invoicing, governance and safeguarding developments, use of social media, installation of Wi-Fi etc. It was commented that 'One off' bookings have increased by 42% and overall revenue by 24% as a result in the updated booking and invoicing process.

The current Trustees were unanimously re-elected by public vote and the key roles of Chair, Secretary etc were proposed and seconded by the committee also by re-election demonstrating a keenness to continue and build on the good progress into the next annual period.

The committee are engaged on numerous projects over the coming months and details and notifications will be communicated through a number of mediums including the Facebook page and notice boards but some of the activities receiving focus are:

- Overhaul of hall parking which will include consultation with users, businesses and the public where appropriate.
- Decoration and maintenance plans including the consideration of linking with local schools for decoration and 'brightening up' ideas.
 - Upgrading CCTV and Security coverage to protect the hall as an asset and users.
 - Rewiring of the ancient wiring system.
 - Upgrade and enhancements to audio and sound systems utilising modern technology.
 - Upgrading and improving entry and access controls.

Village Hall Management Committee - A Right of Reply

We, the Village Hall Management Committee (VHMC), are compelled to respond to the Parish Council's (PC) "Notes from Borough Green Parish Council" published in the August edition of the Voice. This is not our first instance of challenging the PC's unsubstantiated claims. Several inconsistencies in the PC's actions raise concerns:

- 1. The minutes of their last council meeting contained no discussion of a "serious concern" warranting Charity Commission involvement, as reported in the Voice. Such a significant issue would typically be officially recorded.
- 2. When questioned at their subsequent meeting about the Voice article, the PC claimed the Notes were unofficial and authored by a single council member.
- 3. The PC later stated that the matter was discussed in a confidential "Part 2" session, explaining its absence from public minutes.
- 4. However, this explanation contradicts the publication of these "confidential" notes in a public forum. This discrepancy remains unaddressed.

We wish to clarify that the VHMC has no intention of installing a permanent committee. Our focus remains on serving the best interests of Village Hall hirers and

the broader community.

We continue to work cooperatively with the Charity Commission, which has expressed satisfaction with our efforts.

Our annual report has been submitted and our financial statements are current. We appreciate the opportunity to respond to last month's article and set the record straight.

Village Hall Management Committee Have Your Say — Village Hall Parking

By the time this goes to print you will hopefully be aware that parking arrangements at Borough Green Village Hall are now, at long last, under review. The Committee are currently consulting openly with hirers, users, members of the public and local businesses regarding the charging proposals for the car park. The consultation period is Thursday 15 August until Monday 9 September (inclusive).

To be absolutely clear the hall car park (though central to the High Street!) is a **private car park for hall users** and is **not a public car park**. The public car park for the village is located on Western Road. Revenue raised from parking goes back into enhancing and maintaining the hall and car park for the benefit of the community.

The reason for the current review is that existing charges and the provider no longer meet requirements, feedback from hirers and hall users state they are unable to load, unload or park for activities due to non-hall users block parking for up to 3 hours (free). The belief is also, based on research, that block parking actually restricts footfall to local business as visitors go elsewhere due to limited parking turnover/availability.

As part of its mission statement to be inclusive and work with the community the Village Hall Committee are consulting locally over August and September by inviting feedback from villagers through questionnaires and comments on car parking and any proposed charging arrangement for the Village Hall. Hall users of course receive **free** parking for organised events and activities as any revenue gained from hire already contributes to maintenance of hall and facilities.

Options to Consider

Currently the primary options being considered (subject to change due to the consultation) for **non-hall user** charging, along with the 'Maximum stay 2 hours and no return for 3 hours' are:

- Free parking potentially resulting in increase to other local fees to cover costs.
- 2. Free parking for 30 minutes then charges such as £1 per hour apply.
- 3. 50p for first hour then £1 per hour for following hours.
- 4. Straight off hourly rate £1 per hour.

Questionnaire

The questionnaire being used for the consultation is confidential and available as a hard copy, as a pdf, or as an online form. In addition, face to face sessions are being conducted for local business, hall users and general public non-hall users by the committee itself over the consultation period from 15 August to 9 September.



Borough Green Medical Practice September 2024

This update is produced for the benefit of all patients for sharing information on a regular basis.





Dr Fiona Humphreys graduated from medical school in 2015, initially working as a hospital doctor. She became a salaried GP at Borough Green Medical Practice in 2023, working two days a week (Wed and Fri). Outside of her time at the surgery she likes to keep busy, often working for the out-of-hours GP service and in A&E. She enjoys running, reading, and attempting to play the piano.

Respiratory Syncytial Virus (RSV) Vaccination

As we are sure some of you are aware, there is a new vaccine called RESPIRITORY SYNCYTIAL VIRUS (RSV) that will be available from September 2024 and we will shortly be contacting those eligible.

What is RSV? RSV is an infectious disease of the airways and lungs. It often causes symptoms similar to a cold, including cough, sore throat, sneezing, runny or blocked nose. It can also cause wheezing or shortness of breath and lead to pneumonia or other life-threatening conditions. There is no specific treatment and most infections will get better by themselves. Every year thousands of older patients need hospital care for RSV and can sometimes be fatal. RSV can be more severe in people with medical conditions such as heart or lung disease or a weakened immune system. RSV infections can occur year-round but peaks every winter. The best way to protect yourself is to have the vaccine. A single dose is thought to protect you for a few years.

Those eligible are as follows -

Pregnant Women from 28-36 weeks

Anyone aged 75 on or after 1 September 2024 will be offered a single dose.

Anyone who is already 75-79 years old on 1 September 2024 will be offered a single dose.

This is the first roll out of this vaccine and only those detailed above are currently eligible. You can have them at the same time as the shingles or pneumococcal vaccines but they **cannot** be given at the same time as the Flu or Covid vaccines. Borough Green Surgery will be running clinics for these vaccines in September. If you are eligible (as detailed above), please do not wait to be contacted. You can call the Surgery on 01732 883161 to book your appointment. This vaccine can be very beneficial especially if you already suffer from any respiratory illnesses.

Wrotham (St George's) Cricket Club

A lovely sunny Sunday on 14 July set the scene for a Wrotham victory against Hildenborough. In a match restricted to 35 overs per side to ensure everyone got home in time to watch England's defeat

in the Euro final Wrotham batted first. The loss of an early wicket did not bode well, but from then on Neil Pickford and Matt Crisp batted sensibly and once they got their eye in there was no stopping them. Matt was unfortunately out just before the end 2 runs short of what would have been a most deserved century and, with Neil unbeaten on 89, Wrotham posted 217 from their overs. For quite some time tight bowling and keen fielding looked as though we were in for a comfortable win, but a late flurry of aggressive stroke play by some of the young Hildenborough team left them only 20 runs short. A good competitive friendly game again against these opponents.

Next up on 28 July was another home match this time against Kings Hill who won the toss on another hot day and elected to bat. With 3 of the top 4 batsmen scoring 40 or more there was always going to be an uphill battle for Wrotham who did well to keep Kings Hill to 205 runs from their 40 overs. Tight bowling from Neil Pickford (2 for 34 off 7 overs) and Will Booth (2 for 33 off 8), backed up by keen wicket keeping from Jem Blok, meant that we kept the lower order in check. Unfortunately a strong bowling line-up kept Wrotham's scoring in check, accompanied by a steady fall of wickets, so that the reply of 136 off 40 overs left Wrotham well short. Of note Neil Pickford topscored with 35 and Luke Ward, one of the promising new breed, was left with a classy 19 not out.

A first time visit to the picturesque ground at Southborough followed on 4 August, with Wrotham winning the toss and deciding to bat first. Opener Neil Pickford continued his fine run of form this year with a dogged 55, and with Matt Crisp featuring with 32 and Will Booth unbeaten on 21, Wrotham reached a creditable 180 off their 40 overs. It should be noted that wides of 28 also contributed well! Against a class bowling attack the score perhaps undervalued the batting achievement. Southborough's strong openers put the match beyond doubt, although against the odds all-rounder Will's figures of 3 for 23 off 8 overs were a standout achievement. The opposition ultimately knocked off the runs in 27 overs in a rather lop-sided match.
